

ORDINANCE NO. 89 - 6

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PENN FOREST, CARBON COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL PERSONS, PARTNERSHIPS, BUSINESSES, AND CORPORATIONS TO OBTAIN A BUILDING PERMIT FOR ANY CONSTRUCTION OR DEVELOPMENT; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BUILDING PERMITS; SETTING FORTH CERTAIN MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR NEW CONSTRUCTION AND DEVELOPMENT WITHIN AREAS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PENN FOREST WHICH ARE SUBJECT TO FLOODING; AND ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR ANY PERSONS WHO FAIL, OR REFUSE TO COMPLY WITH, THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS ORDINANCE.", Ordinance No. 89-1 enacted January 16, 1939.

The Supervisors of the Township of Penn Forest, Carbon County, Pennsylvania, enact and ordain as follows:

Section 1 - Amendments.

Article 2 - Administration of said Ordinance is hereby amended so as to add a new additional second paragraph to Section 2.01 (B) captioned Issuance of Building Permit. This new paragraph shall read as follows:

Every business establishment open to the public - whether industrial, commercial or otherwise, shall provide at least one toilet room, as that term is defined by the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry and Industrial Board (presently defined at Title 34 Pa. Code Section 41.1), for the convenience of the public. Toilet rooms shall be structurally part of the primary building or structure which they serve and shall not be a separate building. Toilet rooms shall be constructed and maintained in accordance with the standards established by the Pennsylvania Department of Labor and Industry and Industrial Board for employees. The Building Permit Officer is hereby authorized to permit more than one business establishment to use a common toilet room with other businesses provided the businesses sharing such toilet room are located under a common roof, and provided further that such businesses combined service less than thirty members of the public at one time. In no event shall more than five businesses be permitted to share a common toilet room.

Section 2 - Effective Date of Amendment.

This Amendatory Ordinance shall become effective upon enactment.

Section 3. - Repealer.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith shall be and are hereby repealed.
